Whispering River Music is honored to be presenting George Frideric Handel's MESSIAH this year at the Stockey Centre for many reasons. This is our first post-lockdown presentation of this timeless work, and for us it is a profound gesture of hope. It is presented in the hope that Handel's masterpiece, with its humble traditions and simplicity, will touch us all with its joy and profound telling of the Christmas Story.

Written in 1753 and premiered in Dublin, with a major part of the proceeds going towards a poor Irish Hospital, Handel's oratorio has been performed every year since by community and professional choirs and orchestras around the world.

Dec. 21 is the longest night of the year – a night for reflecting on our need to embrace darkness and move gently into the light of spring, however we understand that. In this context, we are also deeply honored to have Ojibwe Grandmother and Elder, Marilyn Capreol, tell a small part of the river of stories that have flowed through the nations of Turtle Island since time immemorial. We do so in the hope that we can begin in our small way to paddle beside each other, each on our own journey. We recognize that we can only travel together by holding deep respect for each other's truths, no matter how painful they are to recognize and embrace. This Dec. 21 we are honored to renew that journey and mark this annual turning point by embracing together the truths of each other's stories.

No one can deny the troubled world we live in, the wars and famines, the devastating loss of life in the Ukraine, the Middle East and elsewhere, and the destruction that man-caused climate change is bringing on us. No one can deny the homelessness and poverty here and around the world.

At the same time, no one can deny the need for joy, for reconciliation, for hope, for a rebirth and renewal of humanity in times of crisis. No matter what your beliefs are, or which river is your choice to paddle, please know that we offer this as one of the great wisdom stories of all time, and in the hope that you will feel Joy as you travel with us tonight.

Please join us in singing the Hallelujah Chorus at the end of the second half of the program. We welcome you to start your journey towards spring in peace and with music.

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Handel's Messiah

George Frideric Handel, Composer (1685 - 1759) German born, Handel spent the bulk of his career in London where he became a British citizen. In 1741, Handel was ill and facing the horrors of debtors' prison, when a wealthy friend, Charles Jennings, gave him a libretto based on the life of Christ, taken entirely from the Bible. At the same time, he received a commission from a Dublin charity to compose a work for a benefit performance. Desperately in need of funds, Handel completed the 260 manuscript pages of Messiah in a short period of about twenty-four days during the summer of 1741. Handel composed this oratorio of modest proportions for sixteen male choristers, sixteen boys, two women, a small group of string players, timpani and two trumpeters. Messiah first premiered April 13, 1742 during the Easter season in the Great Music Hall on Fishamble Street in Dublin, Ireland for the benefit of local hospitals and two other charities. It received its London premiere the following year. The much loved oratorio has been performed every Christmas and Easter since its inaugural performance in every corner of the world.

Our Directors

Brenda Margaret Muller, Artistic Director From her roots as a classically trained cellist, Brenda Margaret Muller has gone on to create conceptual events that weave together poetry, music and song. Working as a Musician, Poet, and Song-writer, as well as Artistic Director for the past 36 years Brenda has created inter-arts events across the province, founded and directed the Ardeleana Chamber Music Society, and released 6 recordings with her trio, Ardeleana, including a CD of original cabaret songs, *Wolf At My Door*, and the first CD to feature only music by Canadian women – *Spinners of Starlight* (1997). She is the creator of two story operas, *Melissa's Song* and *Jonathon's Storm*, both of which have toured acress the province to the critical acclaim of enthusiastic youg people. She holds an Honours degree in Music Performance from the University of Western Ontario, a Mus. Ed and Honours Specialist in Music from O.I.S.E. University of Toronto. She is currently the founder and director of the Whispering River Orchestra in Parry Sound, Ontario.

hilip Morehead, Conductor Philip Morehead recently retired as Head of Music Staff of the Lyric Opera of Chicago and the Ryan Opera Center, a position he had held since 1991. His previous positions at Lyric have included Music Administrator, Chorus Master and Assistant Conductor. In recent years Mr. Morehead was cover conductor at Lyric Opera for Die Meistersinger, Jenufa, Der fliegende Holländer, Sweeney Todd, Billy Budd and many others. He conducted regular season performances of Die Fledermaus, Un ballo in maschera and The Mikado and the premiere production of Anthony Davis's Amistad and student performances of La Traviata, The Cunning Little Vixen, Carmen, Die Zauberflöte and Pagliacci. Mr. Morehead is also a free lance conductor, coach, pianist, and harpsichordist. Mr. Morehead was educated at Trinity School, The Baylor School, Swarthmore College, Harvard University, and the New England Conservatory of Music. Mr. Morehead was a founding member of CUBE, a Chicago-based chamber ensemble specializing in the performance of new music. From 1987 to 2013 with the CUBE ensemble he performed as pianist in a wide variety of repertoire and conducted the ensemble in world premieres of William Ferris An Eden Garden, Sebastian Huydts Three Serious Songs, Russ Grazier Leaving, Arriving, Ilya Levinson The Tell Tale Heart, and other works. For the Whispering River Orchestra, he has conducted on several occasions, including Landscape for tenor, flute and strings by his wife Patricia.

Additional and the prestigious Guildhall School in London, England, she also holds the title of "repetiteur" granted to her by the University of Toronto Opera School. Catherine has performed as a pianist extensively in Canada, England and Germany. She has trained and directed numerous choirs including the Blue Bridge Festival Choir in Newmarket. She has been the pianist for the Ardeleana Trio for 15 years, premiered many works of new music, and has recorded many CD's including "Wolf at My Door" on which she is both vocalist and pianist. Catherine is a gifted teacher and co-founder, with her husband Rod Fogarty, of the West End Music Academy in Toronto. She is also is the pianist for the St. Francis Assisi Choir in Mississauga.

Couis Tusz, Choirmaster Louis studied choral techniques and conducting with Deral Johnson at the University of Western Ontario. He taught instrumental and vocal music at Huntsville High School for 30 years, where he was the Head of the Performing Arts Department. He is the director of the Huntsville Community Choir, an ensemble he founded in 1989. For 25 years he played double bass in the Trillium Dixie Jazz Band. In retirement, he enjoys writing and arranging music, he is a cantor at All Saints' Anglican Church in Huntsville, and he continues to play bass and trumpet for many community-based projects.



With a voice "like crystal clear, tumbling water" that possesses exceptional sincerity and warmth, Amy Dodington (Hon. B.Sc.; B.Mus.) is a Toronto-based freelance soloist, recitalist, private music teacher and member of the Elmer Iseler Singers, a prestigious 20-voice, fully-professional choir. Amy's moving performances in Bach, Handel and Mozart Oratorios and her eclectic solo recitals have earned her a loval, enthusiastic following throughout Ontario and beyond. She has appeared often at the Festival of the Sound, as Jonathon in Brenda Margaret Muller's children's opera Jonathon's Storm, and as a member of the Iselers. Amy has received numerous awards and scholarships, has shared a stage with Placido Domingo and performed under Maestro Helmuth Rilling in the home church of J.S. Bach in Leipzig, Germany. Her exceptional ensemble skills are frequently enlisted by choirs including The Cellar Singers and Soundstreams Choir 21. As a native of Port Carling, Muskoka, Amy is always pleased to have an excuse to return to beautiful Shield country, especially to sing.

ohnathon Kirby, Bass

He made his professional debut with Opera Nova Scotia and has returned for six seasons as a featured lead. Kirby has performed in numerous concerts and recitals; including The Messiah with The Whispering River Orchestra and Haydn's The Creation as Raphael and Adam with The Festival Chorus in Calgary. With Calgary Opera, Kirby has performed such roles as Zaretsky in Eugene Onegin, Angelotti in Tosca and Don Alphonso in Cosi fan tutte.

Hailing from Parry Sound Ontario, Celine Cascanette began studying music at the age of five and it has since been her passion. Celine is a singer and voice teacher in Hamilton, Ontario. Described as a "warm and lovely mezzo", Celine has been teaching students in Popular and Western Classical styles for over seven years while also having experience in Country music, Pop/Rock music, and Musical Theatre. Celine loves to perform in a variety of genres and is as comfortable singing with her guitar as she is in a gown. Most recently Celine has performed with the Masterworks Choir & Orchestra in Oakville, Chorus Hamiltons, Bach Elgar Choir in Hamilton, Hamilton Children's Choir, and Whispering River Music in her hometown of Parry Sound. Celine completed her undergraduate studies at McGill University in Montréal in vocal performance where she studied with Dr. Tracy Smith-Bessette. Recently, Celine completed her master's degree in vocal pedagogy at the University of Toronto under the supervision of Professor Lorna MacDonald.

Abián Arciniegas, Tenor

Originally from Colombia (South America) Tenor Fabián Arciniegas is a Graduate of the MMus in Opera Performance program at the University of Toronto. He has established himself as a versatile and committed performer in Canada. He works regularly with Voicebox: Opera in Concert, Toronto Operetta Theatre and Essential Opera among other companies. Highlights of past seasons include Wagner's Götterdämmerung with the Canadian Opera Company Chorus, Charles Darnay in the world premiere of Canadian composer Victor Davies and librettist Eugene Benson: A Tale of Two Cities, Monostatos in Mozart's Magic Flute, Flavio in Bellini's Norma with Opera by Request; Siebel in Loose Tea Theatre's version of Gounod's Faust; Lippo Fiorentino in Kurt Weill's Street Scene; Roberto in Vives` Bohemios with Essential Opera.
